# Myth-Busting Statistics to Share with Your Property Owner or Manager

#### **Concerns about safety:**

- A dog's breed is not a predictor of its <u>personality</u>. Diet, environment, health, training, breeding, genetics, management, and socialization all influence behavior.
- 81% of dog bites cause slight or no injury.
- <u>Less than 1.5% of dog bite injuries require hospitalization</u>, unlike injuries in general, which result in hospitalization more than 4 times as often.
- Outside of the home, most <u>bites from unknown dogs to children can be prevented</u> by simply keeping dogs leashed. The majority of bite incidents that happen in a child's and dog's own home occur when no adult is present.
- Studies have shown that <u>pets reduce crime</u>. Neighborhoods with more dogs had fewer property crimes, regardless of neighborhood trust level.

### Concerns about damage:

- Fewer than 10% of all pets cause damages of any kind.
- The average dollar amount for repair of damages caused by pets is \$210, and many residents choose to pay for these damages out of their own pockets rather than rely on deposits paid to property owners.

### Concerns about resident perceptions:

- Only <u>6% of renters</u> said they would only rent at a property that restricted breeds or weights.
- Among both pet and non-pet owners, 71% of residents surveyed said that pets can help bring people together within a whole community.
- 73% of dog owners agreed that their pet brought them closer to their neighbors and 49% of cat owners said the same.

#### Concerns about the bottom line:

- 83% of rental housing operators say pet-friendly vacancies are filled faster.
- 79% of rental housing operators say pet-friendly vacancies are easier to fill.
- Residents in pet-friendly housing stayed 21% longer or about 10 additional months.
