## A Pet Parent's Guide to Cat-Friendly Living

#### **Enrich Their Environment**

- **Scratching solutions:** Use cardboard or sisal posts to protect walls and furniture. Even a scrap carpet works!
- **Easy hideaways:** Empty boxes make perfect hideouts—affordable and beloved by cats.
- **Stimulate & soothe:** Use toys, puzzle feeders, and calming pheromone sprays to reduce stress.
- Warm resting spots: Cats love cozy warmth—target a sunny spot or a heated bed, or a warmer room temp.



#### **Litter Box Best Practices**

- **Smart placement:** Choose low-traffic, easy-clean spots like bathrooms or laundry areas.
- The formula: 1 litter box per cat, plus one extra = fewer messes.
- Clean consistently: Scoop daily, deep clean weekly, and seal waste bags to keep odors down.



### Keep It Clean

- Vacuum frequently—carpets, cushions, and pet-favorite spots.
- Schedule deep cleans to minimize allergens and maintain your rental.



#### **Understand & Communicate**

- **Know their needs:** Cats require proper nutrition, regular vet care, and stimulation.
- **Provide outlets:** Scratching posts, perches, and hiding spots satisfy natural instincts.
- Watch their body language: Learn their signals (tail, ears, vocalizations) to gauge comfort.
- **Use positive reinforcement:** Treats and praise make behavior training more successful.
- **Minimize stressors:** Reduce triggers like loud sounds or sudden changes to their environment and routine.
